The Society retains the first right of refusal to publish any paper presented as a podium or poster presentation at a Triological Society meeting, therefore, poster authors seeking publication of poster material must submit to *The Laryngoscope* or to *Laryngoscope Investigative Otolaryngology*. Submission of manuscripts to *The Laryngoscope* and *Laryngoscope Investigative Otolaryngology* should be made no earlier than December 22, 2017 and no later than January 9, 2018.
